### 1. Describe Project:

The Gananoque Curling Club is a not-for-profit organization that is host to many events throughout the year that brings an influx of individuals to our community. To continue with this trend, we would like to start a new event at the Gananoque Curling Club, "1000 Islands Cash Bonspiel" to be held in the end of October 2017. It is more than feasible that this bonspiel has the possibility of bringing several teams, families, and fans to the Town of Gananoque.

To attract the world-famous curlers such as, Glenn Howard, Rachel Homan, Guy Hemmings, Jennifer Jones to name just a few, we require additional funds to market and promote an event of this magnitude throughout Ontario, Quebec and the Western Provinces, and Northern New York, U.S.A.

Tourism comes to a halt in Gananoque every fall. We are very confident that this four-day bonspiel will bring in 32 teams, many families, and fans to our community. During their four day stay they will be supporting our local hotels, stores, and restaurants, all while highlighting our beautiful town.

Within the 4 days' period, the Gananoque Curling Club will host 2 of the banquets outside of our facility in conjunction with the 1000 Island Tourism resorts, as well as a social boat cruise with GBL. We will also work with local businesses to create a coupon style booklet to encourage all participants to support our local businesses.

Although this is a bonspiel for the Gananoque Curling, we are working closely with the 1000 Islands Tourism Group as this bonspiel will also be a large source of revenue for the Town of Gananoque and all local motels and businesses, in a time of year where it is desperately needed. We have consulted with the 1000 Island Tourism group to confirm when this is most needed in the community based on our available dates.

We are also encouraged that if this bonspiel can go ahead this fall, that this can be a annual bonspiel in Gananoque which would be a win win for everyone in the community.

### 2. How Will The Project Enhance The Town of Gananoque

The Gananoque Curling Club is a not-for-profit organization that provides recreational activities for a demographic group that is by and large underserved in Gananoque and surrounding area. As many know, our Curling hosts many large-scale events in the last 10 years. All of these events bring in large numbers of players and their families during what is the off season for Gananoque Tourism. Hotels, restaurants and local retailers will benefit particularly during the later fall season and winter. Moreover, if successful more events of this size and scope will continue to thrive at our facility. The business community will continue to benefit from the Gananoque Curling Club's ability to host events and bring additional economical activity to the town.

Too also note, we have received confirmation from the Ontario Curling Association, that we have secured 2 large scale events for November 2017, and March 2018. These are provincial events, and will again bring multiple people to our town.

By the Curling Club running events it is a spin off effect for our local economy. Based on the calculations that were given by Shelley Hirstwood, our local Economic Development Manager, running the "1000 Island Cash Spiel" in October alone would generate a minimum of \$275,000.00 into the community over the 4 days period.

### 4. What are your fundraising activities/or sponsporships?

The Curling Club has formed several new committees over the last few years to help generate more activities which of course translates into increased revenues.

We now have a fully operating finance committee that oversee all transactions that go through the Club and area to improve.

The Program Committee which was formed a couple of years ago is a huge positive addition to the Club. New events are added yearly. Recently we added a "Rockin n Rollin Spiel" in March, which proved extremely successful for the Club financially.

The unfortunate problem we have along with many other local organizations, is sponsorship is very limited in a small community as everyone is seeking assistance. We do Advertising Panel to generate extra income for the Club, but this isn't enough.

With the utilities costs always on the increase, water, gas, and especially Hydro, to pay these bills extra events must be added. Running a "Average Joe" curling bonspiel will not attract the big names. There are so many bonspiels now days, you must think freely. Being right or wrong "MONEY" talks. Hence, therefore a cash spiel will attract the big names. Big names, come with a following.

This would act as a major fundraiser for the Club and at the same time generate revenue to all the local business and motels.

We have also approached the 1000 Island Tourism Group for funding as well. We are hoping they will collaborate with us in this endeavor as well.

It is hoped this will be an Annual Event. We were unable to apply for Celebrate Ontario grant for the fall of 2017 as the date has passed. We do plan on applying for monies for the fall of 2018, so it is hoped that this is a onetime request for funding for this event.

### 5. If Your Grant Request If Approved, How will you Notify the Community?

A thank you letter to the Community Grants Committee, along with a letter to Council.

We would publicly put a write up in local newspapers, our Club newsletter and website.

The Town logo is on our website, and would be put on all flyer and correspondence pertaining to this event.

### 6. How will you be affected if the Grant is Not Approved?

The event likely will not run. When referring to the budget, you will see we need this money for marketing and promotion, and to also to help offset some of the operating costs associated in running this event. We also have a request for support with the 1000 Island Tourism to help produce a large prize pot.

### 7. How will you Evaluate and Measure the Success of Your Proposal?

There will be many ways to measure the success, not only for the Curling Club but also the business and motels in the area.

We at the Club will be able to measure success almost immediately, but what we'd like to do at the closure of the event, is send a survey to each business in town asking them to measure the success for their business. This would be something new, and we think this could be beneficial at this stage and for future projects.

### 8. Additional Information

If approved this will be an asset for the Club, this is understood. It will not only benefit us, but the community. If we run this event properly with all available resources, this event could become huge not only for us, but for the community on an annual basis.

As previously mention, trying to keep up with the ever-increasing utilities costs are killing all curling club and arenas. A event such as this would help keep up to these costs without having to do major increases in memberships. Raising membership fees is not the answer. By doing that we would loss membership not increase. The bulk of our membership is Seniors and Youth, all of which cannot afford big increases.

In addition to the above, we not only contribute in the community as a recreation facility, but the Club is a community resource as well. Programs such as CPHC (SAIL), and virtually everyone service club including Lions, Rotary, Shriners, Mason use our facility for meetings and events monthly.

- Note 2: Promissory Notes totalling \$35,500, with interest determined annually, were obtained in 2003. There are \$27,000 in notes outstanding. Interest at 3.85% was paid on 14 Apr 2016. Beginning in 2015, this debt was transferred from current liability to long term debt, as repayment is controlled by the Board.
- Note 3: A Mortgage was obtained from the Bank of Montreal for up to \$100,000, with interest at prime plus 1 3/4%. Principal was payable at 1/120 of the total per month. \$93,500 was obtained on 24 Apr 2003. The mortgage was increased to \$75,000 in Dec 2007, with the same terms. On 8 Apr 2009, with \$63,235.20 outstanding, the mortgage was renegotiated with payments to be spread over 180 payments at Bank Prime + 2.5%. Outstanding on 31 May 2015: \$36,925. At the same time, a Line of Credit of up to \$20,000 (\$30,000 from June to September) was obtained, with the annual interest at Bank Prime + 2.5%, payable on the outstanding balance, daily, payable monthly.
- Note 4: In February 2010, a loan from the Ontario Curling Association was renegotiated for \$20,000, with interest at Bank Prime 1.0%, with payments made quarterly for 5 years. An additional loan of \$12,000, with interest at 1.85% paid annually was obtained, with the first payment on 31 Mar 2016.
- Note 5: Beginning with the 2015 report, debt payable in the following 12 months for the mortgage and the OCA Loan are charged to current liability and the balance to Long Term Debt
- Note 6: Because of the expansion over-run, \$35,000 was borrowed from 2 members in 2007, with interest at 5.0%. The outstanding principal has been reduced to \$10,000.
- Note 7: On 15 Oct 2012, \$10,000 was borrowed from a member with annual interest at bank prime + 1%
- Note 8: Project Carpet in arena \$1,040
