	<ul> <li>Mayor Beddows proclaimed the week of April 21 to 27, 2024 as Pitch-In Week in the Town of Gananoque.</li> </ul>

	1. Class III Development Permit (DP) – DP2024-01 – 425 Fourth Street – Horizon Legacy (+Report Council-PD-2024-05)		
	<ul> <li>A public meeting was held with respect to a Class III Development Permit Application received from Horizon Marco Polo LP/Horizon Marco Polo Inc. (Owner), and Frank Belerique, Horizon Legacy (Applicant) regarding the property municipally and legal described as 425 Fourth Street, Plan 86 Lots 161 To 163 Lot; 165 Lot 167 Lot 169 Lot 171; Lot 173 Lot 175 Lot 177 Lot; 179, Lot 180 TOWN OF GANANOQUE, to construct two (2) buildings consisting of thirteen (13) residential units in each building for a total of twenty-six (26) residential units and detached laundry and garbage building.</li> <li>It was noted that DP2024-01, replaces DP2021-23 for five (5) residential buildings with three (3) units each.</li> </ul>		

- The Chair requested that the Manager of Planning and Development present the Application to Council.
  - Brenda Guy, Manager of Planning and Development provided an overview of Council Report PD-2024-05 entitled "Class III Development Permit (DP) – DP2024-01 – 425 Fourth Street – Horizon Legacy"
- The Chair asked the Applicant / Owner if they have anything to add to the staff overview.
  - Mr. Belerique thanked staff and Council for considering the Application, and stated that they are very excited to get started on the project.
  - Hoping to get shovels in the ground by early-June 2024.
  - Eight (8) units are committed to affordability units (as per CMHC formula).
- The Chair asked if any Member of Council have questions or comments pertaining to the Application?
  - Councillor Koiner asked if each unit will have individual water meters and hydro?
    - David Armstrong, Manager of Public Works, understood that the units will have their own water meters. Eastern Ontario Power (EOP) is the agency that would advise on electrical.
  - Councillor Brown, Chair of PAC, commented that this is a great project and is excited to see it get started.
  - Mayor Beddows noted that the property could accommodate another 6 or 7 units. Is there a future plan for developing?
    - Mr. Belerique advised that at this time, there is no further development planned outside of this project. The remaining land will be used for parkland and a community garden for residents.
- The Chair advised that under the Development Permit By-law, comments may be made by the public, however, once a Permit has been approved the only party able to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT) is the Applicant.
- The Chair asked if any member of the public had any questions or comments – None
- The Chair asked the Applicant if they had any further comments pertaining to the Application.

- THE OWNER SHALL INCORPORATE A COMMUNITY GARDEN ON THE SITE PLAN. ADDITIONALLY, THE OWNER SHALL RETAIN ALL MATURE TREES AND VEGETATION, WHERE POSSIBLE, OUTSIDE THE DEVELOPMENT FOOTPRINT AND THAT ANY FURTHER REQUIRED CLEARING IS UNDERTAKEN WITHIN APPLICABLE PROVINCIAL REGULATIONS;
- THE OWNER SATISFY ALL ITEMS AND COMMENTS IN THE STORMWATER MANAGEMENT BRIEF TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE TOWN AND THE CRCA;

- ALL WORKS SHALL BE PREPARED AND INSPECTED BY A QUALIFIED PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER LICENSED IN ONTARIO AND ALL UNSUITABLE MATERIALS BE REMOVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GEOTECHNICAL REPORT;
- THE OWNER COMPLY WITH TOWN BY-LAWS FOR BACKFLOW PREVENTION BY-LAW, WATER WORKS AND SEWAGE WORKS;
- THE OWNER PROVIDE THE TOWN WITH A COMMISSIONING PLAN FOR WATERMAIN INSTALLATION;
- THAT THE OWNER SATISFY BELL CANADA WITH REGARDS TO THE CONVEYANCE OR RELOCATION OF ANY REQUIRED EASEMENTS;
- ALL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH FULFILLING THE CONDITIONS OF THIS DECISION ARE BORNE BY THE OWNER, AND:
- THE OWNER ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE TOWN WITHIN ONE (1) YEAR OF APPROVAL.
