The Steel Workers Park, on River Street, is the site of Gananoque's new Arboretum; the development includes a grove of local natural trees planted and identified with an attractive plaque, at the base, with the name of the honouree and the tree species name.

Under the direction of the Town of Gananoque Trails and Urban Forest Committee, and that Gananoque Parks and Recreation Department, the citizens of Gananoque and area now have an opportunity to honour a loved one who has passed away, was a steel worker in Gananoque; or they may consider celebrating the birth of a baby, a marriage, or the accomplishments of a friend.
