As we continue to fight COVID-19, the goal of the province is to get as many vaccines into arms as quickly and safely as possible. Beginning Tuesday, April 20, 2021, Ontario will offer the AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine to individuals aged 40 and over at pharmacies and primary care settings across the province. To that, the Shoppers Drug Mart in Gananoque will be administering vaccines by appointment only. Call or visit their website to make an appointment.

The emergency and stay-at-home orders have been extended to May 5, 2021 and orders under the reopening Ontario Act have been extended until May 20, 2021.

What does this mean for Gananoque?

Community Services – Parks & Recreation, Marina, Arena, Economic Development & Tourism Services

- Municipal Parks, Trails, Dog Park and Playgrounds remain open for the public to walk, however, the public must use precautions including social-distancing and no gathering.
- <u>Municipal Amenities</u> such as the skateboard park, BMX park, soccer field, baseball diamonds, picnic areas and picnic tables are closed and not to be used.
- <u>Municipal Marina</u> has been deemed a non-essential service as declared by the Province and is therefore closed until further notice. For marina inquiries or questions please contact 613-382-2149 ext.1414.
- Boat Launches remain open as per Provincial Regulations.

2021 Spring Leaf and Yard Waste

- West Ward curbside collection between Monday April 26th Friday April 30th
- South Ward curbside collection between Monday May 3rd and Friday May 7th
- North Ward curbside collection between Monday May 10th and Friday May 14th

Please note that each area will only be collected once.

Biodegradable paper bags must be used. LOOSE LEAF AND YARD WASTE WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.

Residential Spring Cleanup (Dump Days)

This annual event is being hosted (subject to cancellation or rescheduling due to COVID-19 restrictions) on May 22, 2021 from 8 am to noon. Access to the site will be via the east end of James A Brennan Road.

Drop-Off Leaf, Yard Waste, Brush and Scrap Steel

Residential drop-off of leaf, yard waste, brush, and scrap steel yard will be open beginning May 1, 2021 at the end of James A Brennan Road, Wednesdays and Saturdays from 8:00 and to Noon. The site is currently open on Wednesdays from 8:00 am to Noon, until Saturday May 1, 2021.

Town Hall is closed to the public but will continue to provide services by conducting day-to-day services via email or telephone.

Regular Council Meetings continue to be held on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday. The next scheduled meeting is April 20, 2021 at 6:00 PM Via Telephone and Video Conference. Please reference the Agenda for details on how to connect to the meeting.
