#### POST FESTIVAL ANALYSIS:

I would like to thank the TOURISM ADVISORY PANEL for their financial commitment to the project and their confidence in me to deliver the project within the budget presented. I would also like to thank the Lions Club for their contribution.

As part of the Poker Run, the festival was to ensure as many folks as possible, following the Poker Run launch, would remain enjoying the various events which were located at the waterfront.

These included The Thousand Islands Boat Museum, The 1000 Islands History Museum and 1000 Islands Kayaking, and which in some cases, special events were added to their regular program offerings. We used Joel Stone Heritage Park and the Lions Club Pavilion on the Joel Stone "Berm" park to create activities for families.

I will breakdown each event, commenting on each, as to my impression of the event success. Following that I will offer a budget breakdown including actuals to budget and then final comments on the 1000 Islands Waterfront Festival 2021 and general thoughts on its moving forward.

2) FRIDAY AUGUST 27th PROGRAM

The Thousand Island Boat Museum promoted their outdoor café and invited visitors to "Walk The Dock" & tour the "Windswept 111"

The 1000 Islands History Museum ran their regular program exhibit "To What Degree: Canada In A Changing Climate" and heritage artifacts and included a children's event "Kids Crafts with Magella" which was very well attended.

"Head Over Heels" performed a concert on the History Museum verandah, a first-time event which was under-attended due to a Friday working day and lack of signage.

1000 Island Kayaking presented their regular program, indicating they were extremely busy with advance bookings.

The Joel Stone Heritage Park concert was very well attended featuring "Freddy Vette & The Rhinestone Plowboys". A classic old-time country music show.

### COMMENT

I believe we need more activity on the main Joel Stone Park during the daytime hours appealing to families, taking advantage of the existing beach traffic and family picnics on the Joel Stone "Berm"

3) SATURDAY AUGUST 28th PROGRAM

The Thousand Island Boat Museum presented their regular program Including the "Canadian Empress" docked, "Walk The Dock"/ Tour the "Windswept 111" and presented "KATE & SCOTT" on the main dock for a concert.

The 1000 Island History Museum continued their exhibit "To What Degree: Canada In A Changing Climate"; Heritage artifacts and "Kids crafts with Magella".

"SPARE CHANGE" presented a concert on the History Museum verandah to a good crowd.

The Gananoque Lions Club served "BURGERS, DOGS & DRINKS" on the Joel Stone Heritage Park.

Bottle Tree Productions presented "THE LITTLE PRINCE" a play about love & friendship for children & adults at the Lions Club Pavilion on the Joel Stone "Berm" Park. Well attended

"OLLIN DRUM CIRCLE" provided an audience participation of indigenous cultural drums on Joel Stone Heritage Park

"HOOZHEAR" Young people's band performed on the main stage to large appreciative crowd

"CHICKENWIRE" performed on the main stage to a very large crowd to end the day's activities.

#### **COMMENT:**

I believe the Saturday activity went well except there was music needed on the main stage during the Lions Club "BURGERS & DOGS & DRINKS" from noon to 2:00pm. The "OLLIN DRUM CIRCLE" would follow immediately offering continuous entertainment on the park

SUNDAY AUGUST 29th PROGRAM

Thousand Islands Boat Museum offered their regular program with the "Outdoor Café", "Walk The Dock"/Tour the "WINDSWEPT 111" The "Canadian Empress" docked at the museum.

1000 Islands History Museum continued their exhibit "TO WHAT DEGREE: CANADA IN A CHANGING CLIMATE" and heritage artifacts.

Singer/Songwriter Circle with "CLIFF EDWARDS, JEFF CALLERY & TEAGAN MCLAREN" performed a concert on the history museum verandah to a very good crowd.

Ray Anderson THE COOL MAGICIAN performed at the Lions Club Pavilion on the Joel Stone "Berm" park, followed by "CIRCUS JONATHAN", a juggler, uni-cyclist comedian extraordinaire. Many families attended

"FACE-IT TRANSITIONS face painting both Saturday & Sunday for 2 hours each day

Evening closing concert "GEORGETTE FRY UP CLOSE" on the Joel Stone Heritage Park main stage to a wonderful receptive large crowd.

#### **COMMENT:**

The Sunday worked well need more activity daytime on Joel Stone Park.

#### FINAL OBSERVATIONS

#### \*Entertainment:

All went very well, however improvements to the Joel Stone Heritage Park to include more daytime activity and use of the main stage, particularly Friday afternoon, and during the Lions Club "Burgers & Dogs" event and Sunday afternoon.

The Ollin Drummers to perform longer with more drummers and audience participation.

The children's play "The Little Prince" worked very well at the Lions Pavilion on the Joel Stone "Berm"

The History Museum Concerts on the verandah went well. Should run earlier in the day say 2pm for each of the three days.

The magician "Ray Anderson" could perform longer, needed better sound and 'Circus Jonathan" following a good idea, but longer using better sound.

ALL EVENING PERFORMANCES well attended and highly successful, appealing to varied audience tastes.

## \*Marketing

The lack of newspaper advertising problematic, however posters, programs and radio ads went well. The facebook ads for the family shows worked, however more dollars needed to increase reach, greater targeting Signage lacking and needed at every event. Information at various sites (Visitors Centre, Town Web site, MyFm Now, etc) all must have the same information.

## \*Budget

In order to continue more funds needed to cover park rental, insurance and produce a larger event. \$12,000.00 request.

#### \*Date

The 1000 Islands Waterfront Festival better the AUGUST 1<sup>st</sup> long weekend not partnering with the Poker Run. Perhaps a "boat Show" would work

#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE EVENT:**

TIAP is applying to the Tourism Advisory Panel Committee (TAP) for funding to assist with the creation and construction of permanent signage for the Gord Brown Memorial Canada 150 Outdoor Rink. Signage is crucial for the project to identify the rink, not only as a memorial to the late Gord Brown, but also as the Canada 150 Rink that stood outside parliament in Canada's 150<sup>th</sup> year of Confederation and what the significance of that milestone means. This proposal is to construct signage for the road way leading to the rink, light post banners, exterior signage on the rink boards and a stone memorial to commemorate Gord Brown, the Canada 150 Rink contribution and the sponsors who contributed to its construction in Gananoque.

#### **TARGET AUDIENCE & VISITOR ATTRACTION NUMBERS**

The Gord Brown Memorial Canada 150 Outdoor Rink is intended for use by locals and visitors to the region alike. Once operating, the rink will be an additional tourism asset to the region during the curb season, allowing for an additional location for free skates, hockey tournaments, curling events, and other community events. The rink being the Canada 150 Rink placed on Parliament Hill to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> year of Canadian Confederation offers a unique tourism experience for provincial, national and international visitors to the area.

The area is home to not only the Gananoque Islanders, part of the Provincial Junior Hockey League (PJHL), but also a number of youth hockey teams and leagues that frequently participate in league tournaments and home games. Travel due to hockey tournaments in the winter is a huge benefit to the local economy — especially for those businesses in accommodations and restaurants. In addition to regularly scheduled league tournaments, with two rinks Gananoque and the 1000 Islands region is in position to be the site for the Kids 4 Kids Hockey Tournament; an event that regularly sees over 200 teams registered and an influx of more than 10,000 people into the host destination in a 3-day weekend. This translates to a huge economic impact for the area during a time that sees very few independent travelers or organized tours to the area.

The Gananoque Curling Club is an established winter tourism asset for the area. The rink will provide an additional venue for the Club's curb season events, offering space to host additional teams for their bonspiels, tournaments and special events. This year alone they are looking to bring in approximately 140 teams of curlers to the area with their 6 events at the curling club, a majority of which will be travelling from out of town and staying in the area throughout the event. An additional outdoor pad will allow the Curling Club to scale up these events to accommodate more teams.

#### **MARKETING**

The Gord Brown Memorial Canada 150 Outdoor Rink will be marketed through many different avenues. Many of our tourism partners have indicated interest in assisting in promoting content for the rink once it is opened and operational. Partners such as the Regional Tourism Organization 9 (RTO9), Destination Ontario, and Destination Canada would assist in leveraging their platforms to reach larger audiences of potential visitors and further reach regarding the opening of the rink.

Our organization will also be bringing the rink as a tourism attraction asset to events such as Rendezvous Canada, where we connect with travel trade and travel media personnel to sell the area as a potential destination for provincial, national and international visitors. We will also use our network of travel media contacts to generate paid and earned media coverage of the rink in both digital and print publications to garner additional interest and coverage for the rink. We will leverage our database of over 15,000 subscribers to our newsletter to update consumers who have already expressed interest in the area on the rink and additional winter content to generate potential visitation to the area in our curb season.
