Community Granting Committee:

The enclosed grant request is for \$627.05. It would be a gesture of support from the Town of Gananoque to assist a community event that will be hosted by the Gananoque Legion on 21, 22, and 23 April when the Legion will host the 2017 District G Convention which involve about 220 Legionnaires from the 62 Branches in Eastern Ontario stretching from Pembroke east to the Quebec border.

The Gananoque Legion asked to host this event as 2017 will mark the 90th anniversary of its establishment in 1927. In addition, 2017 will mark the 100th anniversary of the death of Lieutenant Colonel Britton after whom the Branch is named and the 100th anniversary of the awarding of a posthumous Victoria Cross to Gananoque's Private Harry. It also will mark Canada's 150th anniversary and the 100th anniversary of the battle of Vimy Ridge.

The Branch's contribution to 2017 will be to fund, with donors, improvement to the town war memorial which is scheduled to be done by this Remembrance Day.

It is likely that this will be the last time that this Branch will host such an event. We have limited facilities at the Branch and must spread meetings and seminars throughout the town, including the Secondary School.

One of the conditions the Gananoque Legion made in accepting the 2017 Convention is that we would provide a level of transportation for delegates to reduce their driving as there is limited parking at the Legion and at the many scattered seminar/meeting sites.

The two previous occasions that the Gananoque Legion hosted such a Convention it was able to obtain vehicles from local automobile companies. That no longer is an option, mainly for insurance reasons. It also would be very difficult to obtain insurance if we used vehicles that would be provided by members as we did for one Convention.

The grant request asks for funds to rent two vehicles on for use on Friday 21 April and three vehicles on Saturday 23 April when many meetings and seminars occur throughout the town. No transportation is would be needed for Sunday 23 April as the one event, the business meeting, will be held at Gananoque Intermediate and Secondary School.

The Gananoque Legion will be absorbing all other costs associated with hoisting the Convention such as rental of the High School and other meeting places, rental of a public address system, etc.

Note:

FY 2014/15 and FY 2015/16 were anomalies. During FY 2015/16 the Legion received two bequests worth a total of \$120,000 that are being used to make major repairs to the building which dates from the early 1950's. In FY 2014/15 the Legion metal reclamation programme earned almost \$14,000. This programme has been sharply reduced in size due to problems finding storage space. Without the bequests and the metal reclamation programme in those years, the Branch would have lost money

During FY 2005 to FY 2014 Branch 92 had five years in which net income that ranged from \$2,300 to \$7,500 and during four tears it experienced losses that ranged from \$1,950 to \$5,750.

Gananoque Legion Operating Budget

Branch 92 has a Financial Committee that adjusts expenses to meet its income. The following budget is based on estimates that are the average of the past four years.

In 2015/16 Fiscal Year the Branch received two bequeaths in wills worth a total of \$120,000. This is the first time that the Branch has received bequeaths.

The dust from the parking lost has raised concerns from neigbours. In addition the gravel lot is difficult to kept clear of stone. The paving will allow lines to be painted to maximize parking.

Gananoque Legion net income has varied considerably over the past years. FY 2009-2010 saw a loss of \$1,593.45 and FY 2010-2011 saw a net income of \$12,518,76 mainly because of a large donation to the Building Fund from the Metal reclamation Programme. FY 2011-2012 saw a loss of \$25,575.52 which resulted because of major renovations to the kitchen and to the Gananoque and District Food Bank that has occupied the basement of Branch 92 since 1982.

One of the major sources of revenue for the Branch Building Fund comes from the Metal Reclamation Programme that began a five years ago and which has raised from \$6,000 to \$12,000 annually. The work of stripping items apart and loading them in bins is being done by a few members of the Branch Executive. Items involve are everything from beverage cans to large and heavy items such as are refrigerators. The programme requires a large area in which item can be store, especially during the winter. Unfortunately, this major source of funds will cease shortly because regulations prohibit the Branch using the current location.
