


The Canada 150 Mural Project - Gananoque

The Canada 150 Mural Project to create the ultimate time capsule - visual storyboard of Canada and celebrate the 150th anniversary of Canada by uniting the 13 provinces and territories together through thousands of Canadian participants into one unified collaborative mural mosaic. The Town of Gananoque is proud to be one of the participating communities. We will be creating a mural that symbolizes our community which will be made up of 400 individual tiles.

Here's how it works... Step 1 - Our Image



Step 2 - Making History - On February 17th the Town of Gananoque will welcome the Canada 150 Mosaic team to our community. The 150 team will begin our mural project starting with the students of Linklater and St. Joseph's. They will be creating paintings for the first 200 tiles for our 150 Mosaic Mural.

The Canada 150 team and the Town will also be hosting two community workshops open to all residents to come and paint the last 200 tiles which will complete our mural .

The first public workshop is February 17th - 6pm - 8pm at the rec centre and the last public workshop is 10am - 3pm on the 19th at the Curling Club .

With panels, brushes and paint, participants will be encouraged to leave their mark by creating a painting that represents their community from their own creative perspective. Every painting will be a story and will become a piece of a much bigger story.

Step 3 - Completed panels - Completed Mosaic

The completed paintings by participants of all ages, and all skill levels, will be assembled into a large mural grid magically transforming the paintings into a unified mosaic that will create our chosen design. Upon completion, the mural will be permanently assembled and protected so it will stand as a legacy piece for decades to come and will be one piece of the Canada 150 Mosaic. The mural will be permanently displayed in our community .
